



## **Dana Corporation to Highlight its Spicer® CTIS Central Tire Inflation System at the**

Dana's Spicer CTIS system works by lowering a vehicle's tire pressure, which increases the tire footprint for increased traction in sand, soft soils, or steep grades. Benefits of the system include:

- Reliable performance – Isolated, non-pressurized seals and hoses eliminate tire leak-down.
- Less maintenance – Wheel valves are sealed to eliminate contamination.
- Drivetrain integration – Engine, transmission, ABS, and axle differential locks can be integrated via data link.
- Safety – Automatic run-flat capability.

"The AUSA Exposition provides a stage to showcase this advanced system as well as Dana's other products and systems designed to meet the diverse needs of military customers."
